Each ministry residency is built around the candidate to help them achieve their ministry goals.

COMPENSATION

Compensation is somewhat flexible and is determined by the resident's financial situation and needs. You will raise financial support for the majority of your salary. Christ Community will provide a monthly stiped which typically makes up between 1/4 and 1/3 of your salary. Residents will receive extensive training on raising financial support in addition to coaching and resources throughout the process.

HOUSING

In some cases, Christ Community can offer housing for ministry residents. Please speak with the Pastor of Sending if this is something you desire.

SEMINARY TRACK

Residents pursuing theological education can earn seminary credit at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (SBTS) or the Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary (SEBTS) during their time at Christ Community. Residents must be enrolled and must cover the cost of the classes. Additional assignments will be required for Residents on the Seminary Track. SBTS students can earn up to 18 hours of credit. SEBTS students can earn up to 36 hours of credit.
